Notes on the words

Bully - Bully is normally used to mean a fellow-sailor. Could 'bully' be a synonym for 'drunk'? it could equally be synonymous with 'bullish' (aggressive) which, in Short's version, might account for leaving your jacket in an alley after taking it off for a fight.

Shinbone AI - a place often referred to in negro songs. There are Shinbone Alleys in Longboat Key, Florida, St. George's, Bermuda, in Antigua, in Pittsburgh and probably more.

Hugill, Stan, 1994, *Shanties from the Seven Seas*:

This shanty is of Negro origins. I came across it in the West Indies. ...It may have been one used originally by cotton screwers.

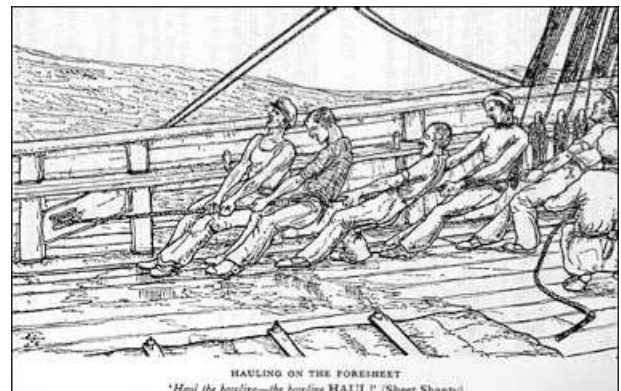
